## COURSE DESCRIPTIONS

### SECTION 1 - PREPARATION FOR INITIAL COMPANY OPERATIONS (PICO) (NFA COURSE) 14 Hours (Saturday & Sunday)

**Instructor: Richard May**

This course is designed to develop a better understanding of the roles and responsibilities of a Company Officer in preparing their company for incident operations. In addition, the course clarifies the transition from firefighter to company officer and the new roles relating to leadership and safety.

### SECTION 2 - FIREFIGHTER SAFETY AND SURVIVAL 14 Hours (Saturday & Sunday)

**Instructor: Tramp Dunn**

This course is designed to explain the most common causes of injuries and deaths of firefighters and explain the responsibilities of the officer for firefighter safety and survival.

### SECTION 3 - INTRODUCTION TO VOLUNTEER EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT 14 Hours (Saturday & Sunday)

**Instructor: Richard Blythe**

This course is designed for those individuals whose

responsibility is to manage any of the facets of a volunteer emergency services organization. New administrative and line officers will derive the most from this course. Seasoned officers will hone their knowledge and basic skills as a manager.

### SECTION 4 - FIREFIGHTER SURVIVAL: SURVIVING A BAD SITUATION 17 Hours (Friday, Saturday & Sunday)

**Instructor: Chris Murray**

This course is designed to familiarize the student with the signs of an incident becoming life-threatening. This intensive training course will provide the students with skills needed to survive the bad situation of an emergency scene.

### SECTION 5 - GARAGE FIRES 14 Hours (Saturday & Sunday)

**Instructor: Jeff Troeltzsch**

This course is designed to present the dangers of attached and free-standing garages, including storage dangers, construction design, extension hazards and firefighter entrapment and flashover hazards. Practical scenarios will be included.

### SECTION 6 - FIRE CHIEF 101 12 Hours (Saturday & Sunday)

**Instructor: Paul Miller**

This class will offer insight into paperwork and other issues facing today's Emergency Services agencies. There will be a heavy emphasis on benefits from the State Firemen's Association, the Firemen's and Rescue Squad Worker's Pension Fund, the PSOB, Worker's Compensation and the State of North Carolina. Packets outlining the procedure to follow in case of a line-of-duty death will be provided as well. This class is designed to be beneficial to all emergency services personnel and is packed full of good information.

### SECTION 7 - ARSON DETECTION FOR THE FIRST RESPONDER (NFA COURSE) 14 Hours (Saturday & Sunday)

**Instructor: David Spruill**

This course is designed to introduce the student to the basic techniques of determining fire origin, cause and recognizing primary clues or evidence of arson.

### SECTION 8 - INTRODUCTION TO PUMPS 15 Hours (Saturday & Sunday)

**Instructor: Swindell Taylor**

This course is designed to meet the objectives and requirements for Driver Operator-Introduction to Pumps for NC certification.

### SECTION 9 - NIMS ICS-300 INTERMEDIATE 18 Hours (Friday, Saturday & Sunday)

**Instructor: Roy Spell**

In this course the student will cover the ICS organizational structure and how it is staffed. ICS positions and responsibilities will be discussed as well as the information flow in the organization. Organization development and staffing are of primary concern. Implementing and controlling resources at the incident will also be discussed.

### SECTION 10 - PERSONAL PROTECTIVE EQUIPMENT 15 Hours (Saturday & Sunday)

**Instructor: Fred Sadler**

This class will meet the objectives related to Personal Protective Equipment for NC FF 1&2 Certification.

### SECTION 11 - EMS CONTINUING EDUCATION 12 Hours (Saturday & Sunday)

**Instructor: Dale Holadia**

This class will meet continuing education requirements for EMS certified personnel. Topics will include special populations needs including pediatrics, geriatrics and special needs persons on Saturday. Sunday will be devoted to a multitude of risk management issues. Skills will be implemented into the sessions.

### SECTION 12 - HIGHWAY SAFETY FOR EMERGENCY SERVICES PERSONNEL 12 Hours (Saturday & Sunday)

**Instructor: Steve Gardner**

The increase in debilitating or fatal incidents involving emergency service and highway safety workers worldwide is on the rise. This program is part of an ongoing DVD series and offers proactive measures an ESO can implement to reduce the chances for death and injury of personnel operating at vehicle-related incidents on streets, roads and highways. This course will also discuss safety issues related to apparatus and POV emergency response.
