STUDENT ELIGIBILITY FOR THE HUSKINS PROGRAM

Student eligibility will be determined by the following factors:

1. High school students in grades 9-12;
2. Students must be recommended by the principal or guidance counselor of the high school for enrollment;
3. The principal or guidance counselor at the high school must certify that the student is taking the equivalent of one-half of a full-time schedule and is making progress toward graduation. Or, in the case of courses offered in the summer, they must certify that the student took the equivalent of one-half of a full-time schedule during the preceding year and is making progress toward graduation;
4. Students must meet the same course prerequisites and admission requirements as adult college students. College and high school credits will be awarded upon successful completion of the college class, and
5. Students must also meet the curriculum program admission requirements set forth by Pamlico Community College (and, upon successful completion of the program, they may be awarded a certificate or diploma).



OBJECTIVES

1. To provide an opportunity for high school students to participate in college educational courses tuition-free;
2. To enhance the motivation and achievement of high school students;
3. To encourage high school students to utilize post secondary opportunities (by taking college classes that will count for both high school and college credits) as a means for pursuing life-long educational and training goals;
4. To maximize the use of State resources while not duplicating course offerings; and
5. To better prepare graduates for the challenges of college and the workforce.



PURPOSE

The Huskins Bill Program & Dual-Enrollment Program provides opportunities for Pamlico Community College (PCC) and Pamlico County High School (PCHS) to offer a seamless educational flow from high school to college. This enables students to take college-level courses, tuition-free while enrolled in high school.

STUDENT ELIGIBILITY FOR THE DUAL ENROLLMENT PROGRAM

Student eligibility will be determined by the following factors:

1. The student must be at least 16 years of age;
2. Students must be recommended by the principal or guidance counselor of the high school and approved by the president of the community college;
3. The principal or guidance counselor at the high school must certify that the student is taking the equivalent of one-half of a full-time schedule and is making progress toward graduation. Or, in the case of courses offered in the summer, they must certify that the student took the equivalent of one-half of a full-time schedule during the preceding year and is making progress toward graduation;
4. Students may be admitted for any semester on a space-available basis; and,
5. Enrollment of high school students cannot displace adult college students;
6. Students must meet the same course pre-requisites and admission requirements as adult college students (and college credits as well as high school elective credit will be awarded to the student upon successful completion of the class); and
7. Student must also meet the curriculum program admission requirements set forth by Pamlico Community College (and, upon successful completion of the program, they may be awarded a certificate or diploma).
